

What is Anti-Social Behaviour?

Anti-Social Behaviour can be:

- any behaviour likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress.
- unruly or drunken behaviour
- threatening or abusive language
- graffiti, criminal damage and noise pollution
- drug and alcohol misuse and abuse
- neighbour intimidation
- vehicle annoyance and inconsiderate use of motor vehicles.
